



Export Controls & Compliance Overview & Update: EAR & ITAR

Are you selling products or services that are covered by the Commerce Department's **Export Administration Regulations (EAR)** or could be covered by the State Department's **International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR)**? Do you know how the Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Asset Control (OFAC) affects you?

Companies that export dual use or defense-related products, services, or technology – or those just entering the export field – will benefit from this full day overview and update on the **EAR** and the **ITAR**. This is a critical issue for exporters, freight forwarders, carriers, international trade consultants, attorneys, universities, and others who support and advise companies involved in exports. Firms that provide high-tech and/or defense products and engineering services, defense contractors, universities engaged in defense-related applied research, and firms that hire foreign nationals and have collaborative arrangements with foreign companies are subject to U.S. export regulations. This briefing will cover the **basics of EAR and ITAR**, including definitions and jurisdictional reach and essential legal requirements for exporting products and technology. **Recent changes in the EAR and ITAR will also be covered.**

Leading the briefing will be Phil Rhoads and Jim Reed, Rhoads & Reed PLLC, NAITA members and attorneys in Washington, D.C., who specialize in this field. Mr. Rhoads is the former chief of ITAR compliance and enforcement at the State Department, and Mr. Reed has held a number of senior positions within the Washington defense policy community. Government and industry representatives from Boeing, Intergraph, and SAIC will also discuss export controls and compliance issues.
